Camp Easter Seal has seen many seasons and changes. It has weathered many storms and the obvious wear and tear that comes from usage over the years. The unique facility is a mix of historical buildings with the chalet and dining hall dating back to the 1930s and more recent structures like the newly renovated swimming pool which supports Camp's very popular aquatics program. The goal has always been, and continues to be, to provide a safe, accessible, and fun experience for Campers to enjoy each summer for generations to come.



With a rich

history dating back many decades,

it would come as no shock that Camp is an aging facility. In 2018, after much review and consideration, SaskAbilities began a capital campaign to raise \$3,000,000 to complete the much-needed improvements to Camp Easter Seal. A substantial amount of work is being done to ensure the health and safety of Campers while maintaining the integrity of older buildings and structures on the property. The COVID-19 pandemic, while devastating, brought with it a unique opportunity. As Camp Easter Seal programming switched to virtual, on-site construction began and work continued throughout the summer without affecting Campers. The excitement of securing a future for Camp has been met with one big obstacle – capital costs have now increased, bringing the new total closer to \$3,800,000.

With the generous support of the provincial government, organizations, and private donors another \$1,800,000 has been secured. It is essential that we secure the future of Camp Easter Seal, ensuring that generations of Campers will be able to access and experience the magic that so many have before them.



We are turning to the communities that know the magic and impact of Camp like no other! Your generous donation would be used for the next phase of upgrades and improvements to Camp including reroofing many cabins with metal roofs, upgrading the electrical in the chalet, dining hall and cabins, completing additional sewer work, creating more accessible pathways, and several steel projects including fixing railings around Camp to ensure that they are secure and safe. A large but very important project yet to be done is water infrastructure. Aging waterlines are needing to be replaced now to avoid future disruptions or damage. There is also a great deal of mechanical work remaining in the chalet, dining hall and cabins, as well structural work to the infamous "pill box", Camp's medical building.

Camp Easter Seal is such a gift. It's a gift for the parents and it's a gift for the Campers. You know your child is going to learn new things and be open to experiences they might not be otherwise with you around. As a parent you know your child is going to be safe. They can just be themselves."
